

Admiral Byrd's Welcome Home By President Roosevelt Will Be Broadcast on Air Today

Wheeler and Woolsey to Be Artists in 'Hollywood Revue'

REAR ADMIRAL RICHARD E. BYRD, returning to the United States from his second Antarctic expedition, will be welcomed today by President Roosevelt as the former revenue cutter Bear docks at the Washington Navy Yard.

The colorful reception, lasting from 1:45 to 2:15 p. m., will be broadcast here through KFRC, KYA and KPO. We are to hear the President's greetings, and Admiral Byrd's response, following which the microphones will transmit the reception and tea on board the Presidential yacht Sequoia, at 6:30 tonight.
